# What we will be learning next week

#### Year 3

**English:** We are continuing the story of the Bear and the Piano where we will find out if he stays in the forest or goes on an adventure into the city.

**Maths:** We are starting a long unit on fractions. We will begin with recognising unit and non unit fractions and working out fractions of amounts ( eg a quarter of 32)

Science: We will continue our investigation into light and what we need to be able to see.

**RE:** We are visiting St James' Church to learn more about the Easter story.

#### Year 4

**English:** We are going to write a summary and a letter based on the Roman myths.

Maths: We are finishing our geometry unit on symmetry and we'll start looking at place value with decimal numbers.

DT: We are going to bake biscuits.

#### Year 5

**English:** We will be planning and carrying out research in preparation for a biography about a chosen person. **Maths:** We will be continuing formal written methods for multiplication and division.

**Geography:** next week, we will be learning about flood plains and the effect of flooding on communities.

#### Year 6

**English:** Mrs Kothary's English group will continue to work on our slow-motion writing piece.

Mr Hardy's group will be writing a setting description to enhance a narrative using paragraphs.

Maths: Mrs Kothary's group will be working on multiplying and dividing fractions.

Mr Hardy's group will be working on averages and Venn and Carroll diagrams.

**RE:** We will continue to explore the various symbols in Christianity and what they stand for.

**PE:** We will be continuing our Bhangra dances.
