What we will be learning after half term

Year 3

English: We will start reading a new book after half term called The Bear and The Piano and write persuasively.

Maths: We will finish their multiplication & division work by applying their knowledge to different worded problems.

History: We will be exploring the Bronze Age.

Year 4

English: We are continuing to write our own stories based on the book Biscuit Bear, editing and upleveling our vocabulary

Maths: We are looking at area and perimeter and completing word problems related to them

PD: We will be starting a new unit Healthy me! We are looking at the different ways we can keep our minds bodies and soul in the best shape!

Year 5

English: We will be starting a new book called Stone Girl, Bone Girl and our focus for this unit will be biographical writing.

Maths: We will be working on formal methods for adding and subtracting big numbers and decimal numbers.

Art: We will be making clay pots and decorating them in the style of the Ancient Greeks as a link to our History topic.

Year 6

English: Mr Hardy's group will be writing a diary entry and planning a short story inspired by the novel Kensuke's Kingdom.

Mrs Kothary's group will continue working on setting descriptions inspired by the beach where Michael is washed up on, in the novel Kensuke's Kingdom.

Maths: Mr Hardy's group will be exploring ratio and proportion. Mrs Kothary's group will start working on multiplying fractions by whole numbers and fractions.

Science: We will be exploring the scientific properties of light.

Geography: We will be beginning to create presentations on a South American country and comparing it with the UK.
