Absence Reporting

In order to maintain accurate attendance records please can we remind parents and carers that for Safeguarding reasons, absences from school should be reported **daily** to the school office with a reason for absence, we unable to accept unwell as an acceptable reason.

Administering medication in school

Children should not bring any medicines into school. They may not have cough or throat sweets in school. If your child needs to take **prescribed** medicine (e.g. antibiotics), it should usually be administered outside school hours. If this is not possible it should be brought to the school office by a parent or nominated adult where you will need to complete the appropriate form. All medicines must be labelled clearly with your child's name. Only prescribed medicines will be administered. They will be given by the staff in the school office. Parents are requested not to approach another member of staff to administer medicines.

Opportunity to support SEND provision in Watford, Three Rivers, Bushey and Radlett

DSPL 9 (http://dsplarea9.org.uk/) brings together parents/carers, staff from early years settings, schools and coleges, local authority officers, and representatives from other agencies, to make sure that there is a range of services available in their local community that meets the needs of children and young people with SEND, aged 0-25, as close to home as possible.

An opportunity has come up for a new parent or carer to join DSPL9 in order to share the views of families in the area and be part of the decision-making process for the services that are put in place locally. HPCI (Herts Parent Carer Involvement (hertsparentcarers.org.uk) will provide support through training and regular meetings for parents/carers to share their experiences. If you would be interested in taking up this role, please contact Gemma Hall (DSPL 9 Manager and SEND lead) at <u>gemmahall@dsplarea9.org.uk</u>

As a parent representative of DSPL 9 you would be expected to:

- Attend half termly DSPL 9 meetings (taking place during the school day both virtually and face to face).
 Join HPCI <u>https://hertsparentcarers.org.uk/</u>As a member of HPCI and a DSPL rep, you will be reimbursed for your time at meetings and for travelas wellas mileage at the standard rate through HPCI.
- Attend New Rep Welcome training session via HPCI.
- Attend termly APRGs (Area Parent Representative Group) via HPCI
- Provide feedback from HPCI to the DSPL 9 group and become the link between the two.
- Provide parental insights and feedback around the support and provision being provided by DSPL 9.

N.B: This is a voluntary role.

Following an initial phone call with Gemma Hall, parents/carers who have expressed an interest will be asked to complete a nomination form; this will aid the DSPL9 group in identifying the successful candidate.

Any interest will need to be registered by Friday 2nd February.

What we will be learning next week

Year 3

English: We are going to continue reading Atlas of Adventures and we will be writing a diary entry on one of our visits to a new country.
