# What we will be learning next week

#### Year 3

**English:** We will be continuing with 'The Spider and the fly' and writing descriptive sentences. **Math:** We will be continuing with written addition and moving onto subtraction. **History:** we are going to be exploring The Stone Age.

#### Year 4

**English:** We will plan and write a persuasive speech based on the book The King Who Banned the Dark. **Maths:** We are going to practise multiplication and division facts. **RE:** we will start exploring the meaning of Christmas.

#### Year 5

**English:** We will be reading linked texts about inspirational women: Lilian Bader, Mae Jemison and Helen Sharman.

Maths: We will be rounding big numbers to 1,000,000.

History: We will be starting our new History topic about the Ancient Greeks.

#### Year 6

**English:** We will continue to explore poetry linked to WW1 and write our own examples using ambitious and historically accurate vocabulary.

Maths: We will be exploring formal written methods for short and long division.

**Trip:** We will be visiting Whispnade Zoo as part of our science topic of evolution and inheritance. In History we will be exploring the causes of the First World War.
